WORLD SUMMIT 2020

The World Summit 2020 took place on February 3-8, 2020 at the Korea International Exhibition Center (KINTEX) in Seoul, Korea, on the theme: "Realizing World Peace and Reunification of the Korean Peninsula through Interdependence, Mutual Prosperity and Universal Values".

Culminating a series of summit conferences sponsored by UPF throughout the world in the last two years, the World Summit gathered more than 6000 delegates representing 170 countries, including former and current heads of the state, former and current lawmakers, ministers, religious leaders, journalists, businessmen, women and youth leaders, Nobel laureates and scholars. World Summit 2020 was significant

in that it was convened at the outset of the centenary anniversary year of UPF's founder, Rev. Dr. Sun Myung Moon (1920-2012).

Prominent national and international leaders attended the event, including: former UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon, Cambodian Prime Minister Hun Sen, Philippines Vice President Leni Robredo, Niger Prime Minister Brigi Rafini, former EU Commission President Jose Manuel Barroso, former U.S. Speaker of the House Newt Gingrich, and Seoul Mayor Park Won-soon.

The Summit featured the world assemblies of three associations recently inaugurated by UPF: the International Association of

Parliamentarians for Peace (IAPP), the Interreligious Association for Peace and Development (IAPD), and the International Summit Council for Peace (ISCP). Moreover, three new projects were launched: the International Association of Academicians for Peace (IAAP), the International Media Association for Peace (IMAP), and the International Association for Peace and Economic Development (IAED).

On February 4, after an opening message by Hon. Ban Ki-moon, the International Summit Council for Peace was launched by Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon in the presence of former and current heads of state and government from around the world. Fourteen former heads of state and

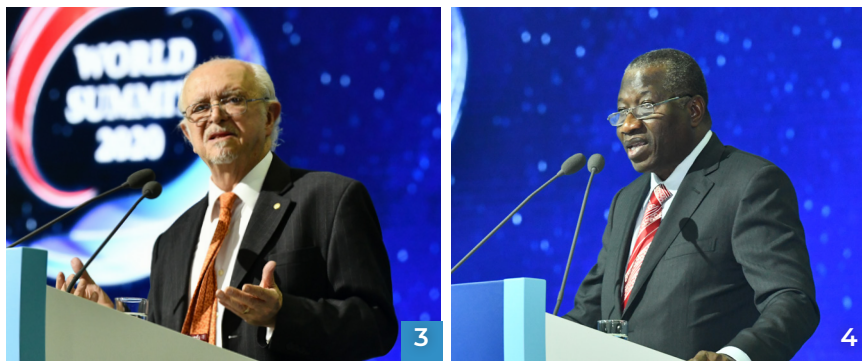

government from the European Union, the Balkans and the Middle East attended the ISCP sessions.

On February 5 was held the 2020 Sunhak Peace Prize Award Ceremony. Dr. Moon presented a special Founders' Centenary Award to Hon. Ban Ki-moon, then awarded the two Sunhak Peace Prize laureates: President Macky Sall of Senegal and Palestinian Bishop Munib Younan, the Honorary President of Religions for Peace. Unable to attend the event due to the health emergency, President Macky Sall was represented by the Senegalese minister of foreign affairs.

11 concurrent sessions were held at the KINTEX center, both on February 4 and 5 afternoons, including forums for parliamentarians and religious leaders, an academic symposium, a youth rally, a science conference on the environment, a forum of Central Asian nations and a forum on the Balkans Peace Initiative. The sessions and breakouts comprised more than 300 presenters and respondents. 500 volunteers were mobilized to support and coordinate all these events.

The World Summit 2020 was the largest event held by UPF since its establishment in 2005.

Participants gathered for an intense five-day program involving conferences, academic symposia, a youth rally, top-class artistic performances - and a lot of networking.

The summit coincided with the celebration of UPF co-founder Rev. Dr. Sun Myung Moon's 100th birthday. For his wife, UPF co-founder Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon, it was the culmination of a seven-year course since the passing of her husband, during which she has endeavored to carry forward his vision for world peace.

In Seoul, each world region's delegation was assigned to its own hotel. The delegation from Europe and the Middle East comprised more than 400 participants from 55 nations, including 14 former heads of state and government. To overcome all the logistical challenges and to care for so many dignitaries, many young volunteers from around the world were mobilized.

I would like to express my sincere gratitude, both to all the participants who came to Korea at this challenging time, and to all the volunteers who worked with great dedication during the Summit. Your presence confirmed that peace is an ideal worth striving for.

H.E. José Manuel Barroso

President, European Commission (2004-2014); Prime Minister (2002-2004), Portugal

It is a mistake, I believe, to confuse patriotism with nationalism. Patriotism is to love what belongs to us. Nationalism very often is to hate what belongs to others. And, in fact, we need to defend also the others. We can love our country and also feel some solidarity towards the "others". Some people say, "This is idealism. With that idea we are not going to solve the problems of the world." I don't agree. I believe that a universal approach indeed is more realistic than

a fragmented approach. We can no longer say to each other, "your side of the boat is sinking." We must solve the issues together. If there is a common problem, we have to find a common solution. That is why I believe that with all its imperfections, the idea of the European Union has some inspiration for other parts of the world.



H.E. Anneli Jäätteenmäki

Prime Minister (2003), Finland

All of us can be proud of certain achievements of women. There has been increasing recognition of their contribution to the economy and to society. Equality in participation and decision-making in society at all levels, from grassroots to governmental positions, is important. Finland has taken the first

place in the good country index. It is based on 35 criteria, such as contributions to science and technology, the planet and climate, as well as peace and security. At the same time, we are ranked as the happiest people in the world. I would like to believe that it has much to do with our excellent and equal education and good climate, but also with equality between men and women.



H.E. Syed Yusuf Raza Gilani

Prime Minister (2008-2012), Pakistan

When our government came into power and I became prime minister, Pakistan was facing a most serious threat from terrorists who were threatening the very fabric of our society. We decided both to negotiate with those who were willing to acknowledge and respect the writ of the state and also to start a military operation against those who were attacking our children. Later they took revenge on me by kidnapping my son for three long years. After many

sacrifices, today Pakistan is by and large free of terrorist activity and we have eradicated their footprint in our country. We need to realize that war is not an option for the resolution of conflicts, whether in the Korean Peninsula or in other parts of the world. The most viable option for the parties is to pursue peace and reunification through peaceful means, political consensus and developing interdependence.



H.E. Enrico Letta

Prime Minister (2013-2014), Italy

Regarding the migration crisis in Europe, we must bear in mind that the juridical distinction between refugees and migrants for economic reasons is the key point; that the search and rescue mission, although our first duty of saving lives, is not a migration policy; that we need to bridge the gap between

perception and reality among the population during the migration crisis period ; that education is needed to provide the tools to deal with the changes in our societies that migration policies bring; and that correct and successful integration and migration policies are essential. We need to restore mutual trust between the E.U. and African countries for the sake of our common future.

INTERNATIONAL SUMMIT COUNCIL FOR PEACE (ISCP)

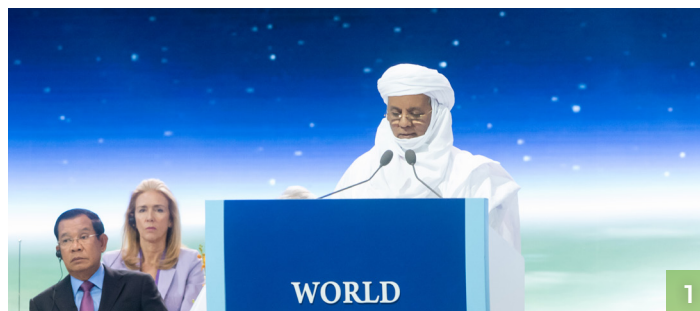

The International Summit Council for Peace (ISCP) was convened on February 4 as one of the main events of World Summit 2020. Held in the central hall of the KINTEX Centre, it was the first global assembly of ISCP since its inauguration one year earlier.

The assembly began with an Interfaith Ceremony performed by religious leaders from diverse traditions, while one hundred former and current heads of state and dignitaries from around the world were looking on, sitting on the large stage.

The Welcome Address was given by H.E. Ban Ki-Moon, the former UN secretary-general, followed by Congratulatory Remarks from Hon. Joo-young Lee, deputy speaker of the Republic of Korea's National Assembly; Hon. Chuichi Date, former president of Japan's House of Councillors; and Hon. Newt Gingrich, former speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives.

In her Founder's Address, UPF co-founder Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon urged world leaders to overcome the barriers to world peace. "We can no longer be onlookers. The future is no longer visible", she said, emphasizing that what is needed is to go beyond national interests.



Keynote Addresses were given by H.E. Hun Sen, Prime Minister of Cambodia; H.E. Brigi Rafini, Prime Minister of Niger; H.E. Henry Van Thio, vice President of Myanmar; H.E. Maria Leonor Robredo, vice President of the Philippines; H.E. Jimmy Morales, President of Guatemala; H.E. Deve Gowda, former Prime Minister of India; and H.E. José Manuel Barroso, former President of the European Commission.

Three ISCP forums were held on the afternoons of February 4 and 5. Speakers from Europe and the Middle East included former prime ministers Dominique de Villepin from France (2005-2007); Felipe Gonzalez from Spain (1982-1996); Mirek Topolánek from Czech Republic (2006-2009); Enda Kenny from Ireland (2011-2017); Enrico Letta from Italy (2013-2014); Syed Yusuf Raza Gilani from Pakistan (2008-2012); and Carl Bildt from Sweden (1991-1994).

On February 4 and 5 afternoon, three IAPP sessions were held on the theme: “Toward Peace, Security and Human Development: Interdependence, Mutual Prosperity, Universal Values”. Chaired by Hon. Ek Nath Dhakal, former Nepal government minister (2012-2013); Hon. John Doolittle, former US Congressman (1991-2009); and Hon. David Clarke, former Australian MP (2003-2019), the sessions featured speakers representing a very broad range of nationalities and political affiliations. The topics were diverse, with a specific focus on the prospects for the peaceful reunification of the Korean peninsula.

Over 20 current presidents or vice presidents of parliaments and government ministers attended the sessions. From the Europe and Middle East Region, the speakers included: Hon. Elena Drapeko and Hon. Vasily Vlasov from Russia; Hon. Hilik Bar from Israel; Hon. Veronica Rosca from Moldova; Hon. Yves Nidegger from Switzerland; Hon. Allal Amraoui from Morocco and Hon. Kimmo Sasi, former member of parliament and government minister from Finland.

Following up on the Asia-Pacific First Ladies Summit held on December 10, 2019 in Palau, the International Association of First Ladies for Peace (IAFLP) was launched at the World Summit 2020. Current and former First ladies, among others, attended the event hosted by the Women's Federation for World Peace, a sister organization of UPF.

Opening Remarks were given by Prof. Yeon Ah Moon, chairperson of UPF Korea and by Ms. Julia Moon, president of WFWP international and director of the

Universal Ballet company. Special addresses were delivered by Mme Debbie Remengesau, the First lady of Palau, and Mme Ingrid Aingimea, the First lady of Nauru.

SUNHAK PEACE PRIZE 2020 AWARD CEREMONY

On February 5, the award ceremony for the Sunhak Peace Prize 2020 took place in the main hall at KINTEX. The founder, Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon, and the Chairman of the Sunhak Peace Prize Committee, Dr. Il-Sik Hong, presented a medal and a plaque to the laureates.

A special Founders' Centenary Award was presented to former UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon, who thanked the founders for their continued commitment to peace and to the unification of the Korean Peninsula. In particular, he applauded Dr. Moon for her

vigorous investment in solving environmental problems.

The co-laureate of the Sunhak Peace Prize 2020 was Senegalese President Macky Sall, who was represented by Senegal's Foreign Minister Amadou Ba. In a video message he apologized for suddenly cancelling his visit to Seoul due to the health emergency. "This Prize is a tribute to the Senegalese people and I dedicate it to them", he said, adding that he offered the amount of the Prize to the African Union Peace Fund as a contribution to peace efforts in Africa.

Palestinian Bishop Munib A. Younan, international honorary president of *Religions for Peace*, was the co-laureate of the Prize. Recalling that the duty of all religious leaders is to raise their voices for peace on the basis of justice, he said he would do so until his last breath. He expressed his gratitude for receiving the award "as an Arab Christian Lutheran and as a Palestinian refugee". "This award motivates me to continue to be a witness of peace, a builder of justice, a defender of human rights, a minister of reconciliation and an apostle of love", he concluded.

The World Clergy Leadership Conference (WCLC), inaugurated in the USA on December 28, 2019, hosted its first assembly on February 5 at KINTEX, during the World Summit 2020. Some 1,200 Christian leaders gathered from around the world, representing many nationalities and denominations.

The co-moderators were Rev. Dr. Luonne Rouse, national co-chair of ACLC-USA, and Ms. Laura Yang, director of the International Committee of the Korea Religious Association. Bishop Noel Jones, senior pastor of the City of Refuge Church in Los Angeles, gave the welcome address.

Rev. Dr. William A. McComish, dean emeritus of St. Peter's Cathedral in Geneva and president of the Geneva Spiritual Appeal, gave the keynote address. "Our leadership as clergy must be outgoing to the larger world; especially to other religious groups, like the Rohingya, that are persecuted", he said. Then, other WCLC Committee members from Korea, Japan, the USA, Asia-Pacific, Latin America and Africa addressed the audience to launch the worldwide organization.

Launched on February 4-5, the International Association of Academicians for Peace (IAAP) is “a new global academic initiative to identify and share the theoretical underpinnings needed to realize a world of lasting peace”.

Co-sponsored by the HJ Academic Foundation of Arts and Sciences, Professors World Peace Academy (PWPA) and Sun Moon University, the Conference consisted of four separate panels. The opening ceremony featured welcoming remarks by Hon. Chan-Yeol Lee, Education Committee Chair of the National Assembly of Korea; Dr. Modadugu Gupta, Indian scientist and Sunhak Peace Prize Laureate; and Amb. Marc Vogelaar, a former diplomat from the Netherlands.

In Panel 1 on the theme “A Vision for the Unity of the Sciences” the speakers from Europe were Dr. Gennady Shipov, Director, Center for Physics of Vacuum, Moscow State University, Russia, and Dr. Martin Ramirez, Chair, Center for Conflict Studies, Nebrija University, Spain.

The IAED Assembly brought together 600 businessmen and women, representatives of financial foundations and research centers, and global experts in economics to explore the role of business in world peace and establish a global network of business experts under the banner of expanding the values of interdependence and economic equalization.

Singapore-based investor Jim Rogers confidently predicted that the 21st Century will be the century of

the Asia Pacific region and that Korea will be the most attractive place in the world within the next 10-20 years due to the reunification of the Korean peninsula.

Neil Bush, Chairman of the Points of Light Foundation, highlighted strategies for companies to support the sustainable development goals, beginning with an engagement from the corporate leaders themselves.

FOUNDER'S MESSAGE

UPF co-founder Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon convened the World Summit 2020 to honor her husband, Rev. Dr. Sun Myung Moon, on the 100th anniversary of his birth and also the 60th anniversary of their wedding. We present here an extract of a speech given by Mother Moon in 1994 on the role of women, and a poem written by Father Moon at age 15.

Excerpt from Mother Moon's speech

Given to women leaders on October 12, 1994, in Seoul, South Korea

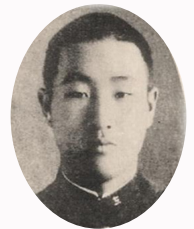
Women are the individual embodiments of truth representing one of the two natures of the incorporeal God, who possesses yin and yang in both external form and internal nature. Therefore, women are not in a competitive relationship with men, who represent the other side of God. Women are not the assistants of men; they are interdependent partners who make the world whole. When God created men and women, God established them as the ideal counterparts for each other and made it so that they can become one through true love.

The fact that the natures of men and women are different does not pose a problem. Those differences are factors that bring on the stimulation of love. In the original ideal, a man and a woman united in true love have the right of equal position and equal status. Moreover, a man and a woman united in true love have the right to participate as equals, and through their love they can always be together. A man and a woman united in true love have the right of inheritance through which each shares what belongs to the other as the second owner. As you can see, a man and a woman united through God's ideal of true love are created as completely equal beings in terms of value. They have the right of identical standing, mutual ownership and participation as equals.

Therefore, men and women are not in an antagonistic relationship, in which they need to imitate, covet or somehow acquire the other's nature and role. Instead, they are in a relationship in which they share with one another, by giving what is theirs to the other through true love. Thus, each perfects the other and becomes one with the other.

From December 9 to 11, 2019, in Koror, Palau, the Asia Pacific First Ladies Summit 2019 successfully featured a series of three high-profile events. The conference, held at the Ngarachamayong Cultural Center, was attended by the First ladies of Palau, Kiribati, Nauru, Papua New Guinea and Mariana Islands, along with three former First ladies (Fiji, Kiribati and Marshall Islands) and more than 500 delegates from 38 nations.

The International Association of First Ladies for Peace, a project of the International Summit Council for Peace (ISCP), was launched during the inaugural session. The main topics of the conference were: “The Role of Women Leaders in Addressing Critical Challenges: Solutions and Best Practices”, and “Palau: Preserving the Environment through Cultural Wisdom.” On December 11, an Interfaith Family Festival was held in the presence of the Palau presidential couple, President Tommy Remengesau and First Lady Debbie Remengesau, along with other First ladies and international dignitaries.

WORLD LEADERS GATHER FOR ASIA PACIFIC SUMMIT 2019 IN CAMBODIA

The Asia Pacific Summit 2019 was convened by UPF in Phnom Penh, the capital of Cambodia, from November 18 to 21, 2019, with over 500 international guests from 46 nations in attendance. Prior to the opening of the Summit, Cambodian Prime Minister H.E. Hun Sen received Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon, co-founder of UPF, whom he had personally invited to Cambodia. On November 19, the summit was held inside the Peace Palace, the office of the Prime Minister.

Among the dignitaries were the vice presidents of Myanmar and Palau, the leaders of the Bangladesh and Pakistan parliaments, and former heads of state and government of Afghanistan, Colombia, Indonesia, Iran, Nepal, Pakistan, Solomon Islands and Timor-Leste. From Cambodia, in attendance were deputy prime ministers, ministers, governors, mayors and chief provincial council members, among others.

Participants included current and former speakers of parliaments, parliamentarians, interfaith and civil society leaders, business and media representatives, and members of the Regional associations Foro de Presidentes de Poderes Legislativos (FOPREL) and Central American Parliament (PARLACEN), which partnered with the Summit.

The opening ceremony inaugurating the International Summit Council for Peace (ISCP) was held on December 14 at the Santiago Government Hall, presided by Santiago Governor Ana Maria Dominguez on behalf of H.E. Danilo Medina, president of the Dominican Republic. Other dignitaries included H.E. Maria Fernanda Flores de Aleman, former First lady of Nicaragua; H.E. Anthony Thomas Carmona, former president of Trinidad and Tobago; H.E. Lupe Rosario Serrano, former president of Ecuador; H.E. Jocelerme Privert, former president of Haiti; and H.E. Jaime Zamorra, former president of Bolivia.

WORLD CLERGY LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE LAUNCHES IN AMERICA

Nearly a thousand religious leaders from around the world convened to inaugurate the World Clergy Leadership Conference (WCLC), an initiative affiliated with UPF, in New York City on December 27. Designed to unite Christianity, the WCLC aims to promote global peace and reconciliation through family values and a healthy society.

Many clergy weighed in on religious divisiveness among other issues plaguing society. “We must highly value God’s Word and ourselves, our family, and our entire region,” said Paula White, special advisor to the Faith and Opportunity Initiative at the Office of Public Liaison at the White House. “The longest journey one can make is the journey from the head to the heart,” added Rev. Dr. Peniel Rajkumar of the World Council of Churches in Geneva, Switzerland. “The challenges of bridging communities go hand in hand with the challenges within.”

On December 28, the participants joined thousands of religious leaders attending the Peace Starts With Me clergy rally at the Prudential Center in Newark, New Jersey, which served as the official launch of the WCLC. The main speaker was UPF Founder Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon, who urged Christian leaders “not to look back, but run forward and embrace the world”.

Speakers in the first session on the theme "Interfaith Cooperation, Peacebuilding and Crime Prevention" included Mr. Jean-Luc Lemahieu, director at the UN Office of Drugs and Crime (UNODC); H.E. Mansoor Ahmad Khan, ambassador of Pakistan; H.E. Dato' Ganeson Sivagurunathan, ambassador of Malaysia; and H.E. Martin Pammer, former Austrian ambassador to Bosnia-Herzegovina. The second session brought together theologians and experts in conflict resolution.

WORLD SUMMIT

BALKANS PEACE INITIATIVE CONSULTATION

The Balkans Peace Initiative Consultation session at the KINTEX Centre on the afternoon of 5 February 2020 was a follow-up to the Southeast Europe Peace Summit organized by UPF in Tirana, Albania, in October 2019. Ambassador Christopher Hill, former US ambassador to the Balkans, brought his considerable experience in the region by moderating the session.

After opening remarks by Dr. Katsumi Otsuka, chair of UPF Europe & Middle East, former President Alfred Moisiu of Albania spoke about the relations between Serbia and Kosovo and their role in the stability of the region, and called on Balkan leaders to demonstrate courage and responsibility toward their peoples in overcoming old nationalistic concepts.

H.E. Anders Fogh Rasmussen, former prime minister of Denmark and former secretary general of NATO, said that full integration into the European Union will bring lasting peace in the region and said he regretted the delay recently imposed on Albania and North Macedonia. "Opening membership negotiations is the tool to keep the momentum for reforms moving



forward, but EU membership must be a process", he concluded, "involving reform, democratization and good governance and the implication of civil society."

H.E. Filip Vujanović, former president of Montenegro, described the challenges endured by Balkan nations to attain the relative peace and stability which they experience today. He expressed optimism for the future and presented the Podgorica Club, a club which he founded consisting of former heads of state from the region, as a contribution to peace in the Balkans. Dr. Neven Cvetićanin, president of the Forum for Strategic Studies in Serbia, shared his conviction that Balkan nations could look to a brighter future when they adopt democratic principles and the rule of law.

Two respondents concluded the session: former Albanian Prime Minister Vilson Ahmeti, who spoke about the mixed demographic configuration in the Balkans and its positive role for regional cooperation; and French political scientist Emmanuel Dupuy, who placed the regional peace process in the greater context of the competition for influence between the USA and the EU, Russia and China.
